

PROFILE OF DR. DAN-BRIGHT DZORGBO

Dr. Dan-Bright S. Dzorgbo, Senior Lecturer at the Department of Sociology, is the 18th Master of Mensah Sarbah Hall. He was born in Avatime-Gbadzeme. He attended Mawuli Secondary School, Ho, and Prempeh College, Kumasi, where he studied for the Ordinary and Advanced Level Examinations respectively.

He proceeded to the University of Ghana, Legon where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Honours Degree in Sociology with Geography in 1984. He obtained his MPhil Degree in Sociology in 1995 from the University of Oslo, and in 1998, received his PhD from Uppsala University in Sweden.

He joined the Department of Sociology as a lecturer in September, 1999. He was Head of Sociology Department between 2011/2012 and 2014/20015 academic year and is a member of the Graduate Committee of the Sociology Department. He has served and continues to serve on numerous boards and committees of the University.

His main research interests are in areas such as state-development nexus, historical transformation of societies, institution building and economic development, scientific communication, particularly the impact of Information Communication Technologies on international collaborative research activities and on society in developing countries, the impact of internet and mobile phone usage, the socio-cultural dimension of health and illness, democracy and women's political participation, women's rights and welfare and the African Union and continental integration.

Dr. Dzorgbo has served as external examiner to the Department of Sociology, Kamarai University, Madurai-India, the Department of Planning and Community Studies (ILP) of the University of Tromso, now the Artic University of Norway, the Institute of Studies in Education (OISE) and Department of Sociology and Equity Studies in Education (SESE) of University of Toronto, Ontario-Canada. He is currently an external examiner to the Department of Sociology and Social Work, Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, and the University of Development Studies, Tamale. He serves on the National Accreditation Board's panels for accrediting sociology and other social science programmes for universities in Ghana.

PROFILE OF DR. DAN-BRIGHT DZORGBO

He has consulted for many national and international development agencies, civil society organizations and NGOs. They include the Institute for Democratic Governance IDEG, UNDP, the European Commission, WHO, SOS Ghana, Christian Council of Ghana, Ghana Aids Commission, Panos Institute in Senegal, Idasa in South Africa, Ghana Telecommunications Company Limited now Vodafone Ghana and World Vision Ghana. He has also engaged in numerous extension activities in Ghana. Dr. Dzorgbo is currently the President of Ghana Sociological and Anthropological Association of Ghana.

Dr. Dzorgbo has published books, monographs, peer-reviewed journal articles and technical reports, among them are: Sociological theory: Classical ideas and their application in the African context, which is currently a major textbook on sociological theory and is widely used in universities in Ghana; *Ghana in search* of development: The challenge of governance, economic management and institution building; Foreign aid and Ghana: Power dynamics of partnership in development and Sociology and development issues in Ghana: A sociological reader. He has also published many articles in local and international peerreviewed journals and presented papers at many national and international conferences, seminars and workshops.



MENSAH SARBAH HALL

Mensah Sarbah Hall, the fifth Hall of the University, opened in October, 1963. It stands in the southern part of the University of Ghana's Legon Campus. The Hall consists of a main Hall built around a quadrangle and a number of annexes standing to the north and east the last two south annexes are attached to the Hall. Until October 1991, Mensah Sarbah was the only co-ed Hall of Residence in the University, which made it quite unique among the Halls.

The Governing Body of the Hall is the Council, which is responsible to the full body of Fellows who form the Senate. Students' affairs are handled by students' own elected government headed by a President, while general administration of the Hall is under the Master who is assisted by the Senior Tutor and Tutors on the one hand, the Bursar and the Librarian on the other. The Senior Common Room affairs are managed by an elected Committee under the President of the Senior Common Room. The Hall is named after the famous Ghanaian jurist, writer and statesman, John Mensah Sarbah of Cape Coast. The Hall marked the centenary of John Mensah Sarbah in 2011. The decision to name this hall of residence after John Mensah Sarbah was undoubtedly intended to honour this distinguished Ghanaian patriot, jurist and scholar, as well as to immortalise the ideals of knowledge, service and honour to which he so gallantly devoted his entire life. Those ideals, which have become the motto of the hall, are the greatest legacy John Mensah Sarbah left for future generations of Ghanaians.

THE LOGO OF THE HALL:

The Hall's logo which brings out the principal features of Mensah Sarbah's life, consists of a scale, which signifies the legal profession; the stool and the book, symbolizing culture while the hill and the castle are intended to depict the familiar landscape of Cape Coast with its many hills and forts. At the same time, the Castle is intended to symbolize strength and honour.
